HARRIS COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 96

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Harris County Water Control and Improvement District No. 96 (the "District") met in regular session, open to the public, at 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, December 4, 2018, at 1980 Post Oak Boulevard, Suite 1380, Houston, Texas, a designated meeting place outside the boundaries of the District, whereupon, the roll was called of the members of the Board, to-wit:

All members of the Board were present except Directors Sileo and Bates, thus constituting a quorum.

Also attending the meeting were Rusty Campbell of Fall Creek Development Partners, developers of property within the District; Cindy Fields, Brett Mann, and Thomas Meurer of Brown & Gay Engineers, Inc. ("BGE"), engineer for the District; Robin Goin of Bob Leared Interests ("BLI"), tax-assessor/collector for the District; Kas Wright and Jarrod Lee of Lifestyle Directors, Inc. ("Lifestyle"), recreation director for the District Park; Whitney Aelmore and Juan Alexander of SI Environmental ("SI"), operator for the District; Phil Halbert of Champions Hydro-Lawn, Inc. ("Champions"); Curtis Brown of Residential Recycling and Refuse Of Texas, Inc. ("RRRT"); and Ryan E. LaRue and Mary Drews of Sanford Kuhl Hagan Kugle Parker Kahn LLP ("SK Law"), attorneys for the District.

Directors Sileo and Bates and Debra Loggins of L&S District Services, LLC ("L&S"), bookkeeper for the District, entered the meeting in progress.

The meeting was called to order at 12:01 p.m. Copies of the notices of the meeting are attached hereto.

HEAR FROM PUBLIC

The Board noted that there were no members of the public who wished to address the Board.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF NOVEMBER 6, 2018

The Board reviewed the minutes from the meeting held November 6, 2018, previously distributed to the Board. Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Hurd, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve such minutes as submitted.

DISCUSS SECURITY ISSUES

The Board noted that no security report had been submitted.

REVIEW WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION REPORT

The Board recognized Mr. Brown, who reviewed with the Board collection of solid waste and recycling materials within the District. The Board noted that no action was required

At this time, Mr. Brown left the meeting.

APPROVE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AGREEMENT [LIFESTYLE DIRECTORS, INC.]

The Board recognized Mr. Lee, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board a proposed Independent Contractor Agreement between the District and Lifestyle. Mr. LaRue noted that the current Agreement will expire on December 31, 2018. He stated that the proposed Agreement would be for a term of two years, and that the compensation for services would increase from the current fee of \$70,620.00 (2018) to \$72,420.00 for 2019 and \$74,340.00 for 2020.

Director Jackson stated that, upon engagement of a new maintenance/porter service company for the Park and Sports Complex (the "Park"), there may be many amendments to the proposed Agreement, and expressed his preference that the current Agreement be continued on a "month by month" basis until such time as a new maintenance company is engaged. He noted that the services provided by Lifestyle and the services to be provided by a maintenance company could overlap.

At this time, Director Sileo and Ms. Loggins entered the meeting.

Mr. Lee stated that Lifestyle could continue to provide service on a month by month basis until such time as a maintenance company is engaged by the District. He noted that the new maintenance company could be employed by Lifestyle after such time as the Board has decided on a maintenance company for the Park.

After discussion, the Board requested that Mr. Lee amend such proposed Agreement to provide for services on a month by month basis, not to exceed 90 days from January 1, 2019.

The Board determined to defer such matter until the next meeting.

At this time, Director Bates entered the meeting.

RECREATION REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Wright, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Recreation Report for the month of November, a copy of which is attached hereto. Ms. Wright updated the Board on repairs ongoing in the Park, including pictures of the same.

Ms. Wright informed the Board that the parking lot in the Park needs to be re-striped. She stated that SMR Striping ("SMR") had re-striped the parking lot in December, 2016, at a cost of \$2,099.00. The Board requested that Ms. Wright obtain proposals for restriping the parking lot from SMR and from Stripes & Stops Company. The Board determined that if the quotes obtained are close and are under \$2,500.00, Ms. Wright should accept the quote from Stripes & Stops, but if there is a large discrepancy in the quotes, or if both quotes exceed \$2,500.00, Ms. Wright should discuss such matter with the Board at the next meeting.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Jackson, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Recreation Report as submitted.

Mr. LaRue then submitted to and reviewed with the Board a proposed Request for Proposal to Maintain the Fall Creek Sports Complex ("RFP"), previously distributed to the Board, a copy of which is attached hereto. He noted that the RFP includes a comprehensive services list, as well as a recreation director checklist, and the names of companies which will receive the RFP. He stated that the RFP will include a provision whereby a 30-day termination clause is to be included in any proposed agreement. He questioned the Board as to whether services currently being performed by third party contractors, such as Davey Tree and JaniKing, should be included in the RFP.

After discussion, the Board determined to include the janitorial services currently performed by JaniKing in the RFP, but determined to exclude all other services currently performed by third party contractors from the RFP. The Board determined that Davey Tree could be contacted "as needed" by Ms. Wright at the direction of the Board.

The Board discussed the proposed RFP, and noted that the days and times for porter services should be specified.

Mr. Halbert discussed with the Board the porter services provided by Champions at other parks and/or sports complexes that engage Champions for the same. He stated that some parks require service on a daily basis, and other parks require less maintenance. He suggested that the RFP be as specific as possible regarding the services to be performed.

Ms. LaRue questioned whether the Board would prefer to appoint a sub-committee to discuss the RFP to detail specific days and times for a porter service, as well as a more specific list of services to be performed.

After discussion, the Board determined that the Board of the Friends of Fall Creek Park ("FOFC") should discuss the RFP and prepare the specifics to be included as discussed. The Board determined to review the RFP after such time as the FOFC Board has met and discussed such matter. Mr. LaRue stated that he would contact the FOFC Board to schedule a meeting.

TAX ASSESSOR/COLLECTOR'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Goin, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Tax Assessor/Collector's Report for the month of November, a copy of which is attached hereto. She noted that approximately 5.367% of the 2018 taxes had been collected. Ms. Goin also submitted to the Board the delinquent list.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Jackson, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Tax Assessor/Collector's Report as submitted.

At this time, Ms. Goin left the meeting.

BOOKKEEPER'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Loggins, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Bookkeeper's Report, including payment of the checks listed therein, as well as a budget comparison and the investment report, copies of which are attached hereto. Ms. Loggins stated that the surplus funds in the District's Park Capital Projects Fund in the amount of \$405,778.98 will be the first funds used to pay for improvements to the Park, as such expenses occur, in connection with the grant from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department ("TPWD").

Ms. Loggins requested that the Board defer adoption of an amended budget for the fiscal year ending July 31, 2019 at this time, as she is in the process of assembling additional information in connection with the same. The Board discussed amendments to the budget, and determined that the engineering expenses associated with improvements to the piping and the wet wells at Lift Stations Nos. 1 and 2 should be included in the proposed budget, and the expensed associated with the rehabilitation of Lift Stations Nos. 1 and 2 should be placed in the budget for the fiscal year ending July 31, 2020.

Director Sileo noted that there are additional surplus funds from the Series 2014 Bonds, and that such surplus funds could possibly be used for the rehabilitation of List Stations Nos. 1 and 2, if approved by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ").

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Jackson, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Bookkeeper's Report and payment of the checks listed therein, and to defer adoption of an amended budget until the next scheduled meeting.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Fields, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Engineer's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto. She updated the Board on ongoing engineering matters.

Ms. Fields requested that the Board authorize preparation of plans and specification for the rehabilitation of Lift Stations Nos. 1 and 2 and construction of a raised walkway around the existing generator, as discussed at the previous meeting. She noted that the engineering fees would be adjusted based upon the bids received in connection with such project.

Upon motion by Director Jackson, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to authorize BGE to prepare plans and specification for the rehabilitation of Lift Stations Nos. 1 and 2 and construction of a raised walkway around the existing generator as discussed.

Ms. Fields next discussed with the Board Water Well No. 1 (the "Well"). She stated that inclement weather has not permitted the contractor to complete coating items on the punch list, and that the generator still needs to be tested in order to be placed on-line.

Ms. Fields then submitted to and reviewed with the Board Pay Estimate No. 16 to Bussell & Sons, LLC in connection with construction of the Well in the amount of \$3,924.00, and recommended payment of the same. She also submitted to and reviewed with the Board an invoice from Ninyo & Moore in the amount of \$692.75 for concrete testing.

Upon motion by Director Jackson, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve payment of Pay Estimate No. 16 as submitted, and to approve payment of the invoice submitted by Ninyo & Moore, based upon the recommendation of the District Engineer.

Ms. Fields next discussed with the Board the contract for construction of Lift Station No. 6 and Force Main (the "Lift Station"). She stated that Reddico Construction Co., Inc. ("Reddico") has located the existing pipelines in connection with crossing the easement, as previously discussed, and that one pipeline was three feet deeper than anticipated, which lowered the force main depth to just within the water table. She discussed with the Board the additional work that was required as a result of the same, and reviewed with the Board proposed Change Order No. 1

in connection with such contract, a copy of which is attached hereto. She noted that a proposed manhole will be deleted from the contract, which will result in a credit to the contract.

Ms. Fields then submitted to and reviewed with the Board Pay Estimate No. 3 to Reddico in the amount of \$99,366.30, and recommended payment of the same. Ms. Fields also submitted to and reviewed with the Board invoices from Tolunay-Wong Engineers, Inc. ("Tolunay-Wong") in the amounts of \$560.00 and \$1,569.50, respectively in connection with materials testing relating to the concrete for the wet well, and recommended payment of the same. Ms. Fields further submitted to and reviewed with the Board a Facilities Extension Agreement between the District and CenterPoint Energy ("CenterPoint"), as well as an electric service request form to CenterPoint, in connection with extension of service to the Lift Station. She stated that CenterPoint is charging \$11,240.00 to extend service to the Lift Station.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Jackson, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve payment of Pay Estimate No. 3 as submitted, to approve Change Order No. 1 as submitted, to pay the invoices submitted by Tolunay-Wong as submitted, and to authorize execution of the documents submitted by CenterPoint and payment to CenterPoint for extension of service to the Lift Station, based upon the recommendation of the District Engineer.

Ms. Fields noted that the meeting scheduled with Harris County to discuss the proposed widening of Mesa Road, as discussed at the previous meeting, had been cancelled by Harris County, and that a new meeting date has been requested.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Bates, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Engineer's Report as submitted.

HEAR DEVELOPER'S REPORT

Mr. Campbell updated the Board on residential and commercial development within the District. The Board noted that no action was required.

OPERATOR'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Aelmore, who presented the Operator's Report for the month of November, a copy of which is attached hereto. Ms. Aelmore updated the Board regarding operations within the District. She noted that such Report includes information regarding the supply of surface water as well as production of ground water.

Ms. Aelmore also submitted to and reviewed with the Board the delinquent accounts. She stated that proper notice had been given as well as the opportunity to be heard in order to explain, contest, or correct the utility service bills and show reason why utility service should not be terminated for reason of nonpayment, all as required by the District's Rate Order.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to authorize termination of service as the customers were neither present at the meeting nor presented any written statement on the matter.

Ms. Aelmore then discussed with the Board the delinquent account of Ms. Sandra Dominique, as discussed at the previous meeting. She stated that SI had contacted Western Union, and had been informed that the second payment made by Ms. Dominique at the Western Union location was made with a check, but that the teller at the Western Union had processed the payment as a "cash" transaction. Ms. Aelmore stated that the check had "bounced" due to insufficient funds. She stated that she has not received any further communication from Ms. Dominique, and that such account remains delinquent. She further noted that the "protected" status of such account has expired. The Board requested that Ms. Aelmore contact Ms. Dominique to offer a payment plan for payment of the delinquent amount owed, and that if Ms. Dominique does not respond, to notify her of possible disconnection of service as provided for in the District's Rate Order, which would occur in 2019.

Ms. Aelmore informed the Board that the new track gate at the Water Plant installed by Clements Fence, as discussed at the previous meeting, is not acceptable, and that she has contacted Clements Fence to remedy the problems.

Ms. Aelmore then submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Collection Report, a copy of which is attached hereto. Director Jackson stated that one of the accounts listed is still a resident of the District, and that he would provide the new address to Ms. Aelmore.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Operator's Report as submitted.

REPORT FROM CHAMPION'S HYDRO-LAWN

The Board recognized Mr. Halbert, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board a written report and pictures regarding repair and maintenance of detention and drainage facilities within the District, a copy of which is attached hereto.

The Board noted that no action was required.

HEAR ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Adopt Resolution Establishing Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program

Mr. LaRue submitted to and reviewed with the Board a proposed Resolution Establishing Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program relating to the grant received from the TPWD for expansion of the Park. He stated that the proposed Resolution is required as a condition to receiving the grant funds from the TPWD under Chapter 375 of the Texas Local Government Code, and would provide that the District would adopt the Fall Creek Athletic Facility, Phase 2 Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program, as listed in the attachment to such Resolution, a copy of which is attached hereto. He stated that he would work with BGE to insure that the guidelines and procedures listed are followed.

The Board requested that Mr. LaRue provide additional information regarding the efforts the District must undertake to comply with the requirements of such Program. Mr. LaRue stated that he would research such matter further and report back to the Board.

It was the consensus of the Board to defer adoption of such Resolution until the next meeting of the Board.

Consider approval of Encroachment Agreement

Mr. LaRue requested that the Board defer approval of the Encroachment Agreement between the District and the Fall Creek Homeowner's Association ("HOA") until such time as such matter has been discussed further with representatives of the HOA.

It was the consensus of the Board to defer such matter at this time.

Approve First Amendment to Reclaimed Water Supply Agreement

Mr. LaRue submitted to and reviewed with the Board the First Amendment to Reclaimed Water Supply Agreement between the District and Escalante GCOH, LLC ("Escalante"), which agreement was previously discussed by the Board and provides for the District to reduce the markup charged to Escalante for reclaimed water from 10% to 5% for a period of five (5) years, and further provides for a penalty of 10% per month if the invoices are not paid within 45 days after issuance.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Bates, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the First Amendment to Reclaimed Water Supply Agreement between the District and Escalante as submitted.

Appoint members to FOFC Park Board of Directors

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Hurd, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to appoint Matthew Carpenter, Kas Wright, James Nicas, Lonnie Jackson, and Brett Sileo to the FOFC Park Board of Directors.

RECEIVE ARCHITECT/ENGINEER REPORT REGARDING PARK PROJECT

The Board recognized Mr. Meurer, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board updated renderings of the designs in connection with the improvements to the Park, as discussed at previous meetings. He reviewed with the Board drawings of the designs, including the playground equipment and the batting cages, and various other improvements previously discussed. Copies of the renderings are attached hereto. The Board requested that BGE supply a copy of the renderings to the HOA.

The Board noted that the Splash Pad is located close to the sand volleyball court, and questioned whether or not a "foot washing" station should be constructed at the sand volleyball court to help alleviate the amount of sand that may infiltrate the Splash Pad. Mr. Meurer stated that he would include a foot washing station at the sand volleyball court in the plans and renderings.

The Board also discussed the proposed batting cages, and noted that artificial turf should be installed over the concrete floors of such cages. Mr. Meurer stated that he would include artificial turf for the batting cage floors.

Mr. Meurer requested that the Board approve the site plan renderings, which will be submitted to Harris County for review in January, 2019.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the site plan renderings, subject to addition of a foot washing station at the sand volleyball court and addition of artificial turf on the batting cage floors.

Mr. LaRue submitted to and reviewed with the Board the TPWD Grant Project Instructions for Fund Management, a copy of which is attached hereto. He noted that the TPWD representative is discussing with representatives of the Federal Government of the United States certain federal law requirements which affect employees, noting that the District has no employees. He stated that a contract with the TPWD should be forthcoming soon.

The Board noted that no action was required.

It was the consensus of the Board to schedule the next meeting of the Board on Tuesday, January 8, 2019.

THERE being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

About Harris County Water Control and Improvement District No. 96

A political subdivision of the State of Texas, the District was formed in 1966 by an order of the Texas Water Rights Commission, now known as the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), for the purpose of providing water, sanitary sewer and drainage facilities to serve the land within its boundaries. Additionally, the District may, subject to certain limitations, develop and finance parks and recreational facilities. The District operates under the provisions of Chapters 49 and 51 of the Texas Water Code and other general statutes applicable to water control and improvement districts. The District presently contains approximately 1,184 acres of land and is located approximately 13 miles northeast of downtown Houston and approximately two miles east of the intersection of US Highway 59 and North Sam Houston Parkway (Beltway 8). The District is adjacent to the Golf Club of Houston and encompasses the Fall Creek master planned community.



After having all of the pipelines field located, it was determined that one was 3 feet deeper than anticipated, which lowered the force main depth into the groundwater table. The original depth of the force main was not in the water table according to the soil boring, but the addition of approximately 3 feet has placed us just within the water table. Dewatering with the use of well points at an additional cost of \$7,500.00 was required to complete the bore. Field location of existing dry utilities at the edge of the pipeline easement required the addition of 10 feet to the bore length. Also, we were able to delete a proposed manhole which will result in a credit of \$5,718.15. A formal change order will be presented to the Board to address the net additional expense of \$2,831.85. The lift station crew has been delayed by the wet weather and is currently working on the installation of underground electrical conduit and has just poured the concrete top. We are presenting Pay Estimate No. 3 in the amount of \$99,366.30 for the Board's consideration as well as two invoices from lab, Tolunay-Wong Engineers, Inc., for materials testing in the amounts of \$560.00 and \$1,569.50. We are also presenting the Facilities Extension Agreement along with the electric service request forms from CenterPoint for the Board's execution. CenterPoint is requiring \$11,240.00 for the service extension to serve the lift station.







TEXAS LAW AN ACT TEXAS HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE TITLE 9

CHAPTER 752 - Safety of persons engaged in activities in proximity of high voltage electric lines; restrictions

SECTION 001. DEFINITIONS

- (1) "High voltage" means more than 600 volts measured between conductors or between a conductor and the ground.
- (2) "Overhead line" means a bare or insulated electric conductor installed above ground but does not include a conductor that is de-energized and grounded or that is enclosed in a rigid metallic conduit.

SECTION 002. EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES AND ACTIVITIES

- (A) This chapter does not apply to the construction, reconstruction, operation, or maintenance by an authorized person of overhead electrical or communication circuits or conductors and their supporting structures and associated equipment that are part of a rail transportation system, an electrical generating, transmission, or distribution system or a communication system.
 - (B) In this section, "authorized person" means:
- (1) an employee of a light and power company, an electric cooperative, or a municipality working on his employer's electrical system;
- (2) an employee of a transportation system working on the system's electrical circuits;
 - (3) an employee of a communication utility;
- (4) an employee of a state, county, or municipal agency that has authorized circuit construction on the poles or structures that belong to an electric power company, an electric cooperative, a municipal or transportation system, or a communication system;
- (5) an employee of an industrial plant who works on the plant's electrical system; or
- (6) an employee of an electrical or communications contractor who is working under the contractor's supervision.

SECTION 003. TEMPORARY CLEARANCE OF LINES

- (A) A person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for temporary work or a temporary activity or function closer to a high voltage overhead line than the distances prescribed by this chapter must notify the operator of the line at least 48 hours before the work begins.
- (B) A person, firm, corporation, or association may not begin the work, activity, or function under this section until the person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for the work, activity, or function and the owner or operator, or both, of the high voltage overhead line have negotiated a satisfactory mutual arrangement to provide temporary de-energization and grounding, temporary relocation or raising of the line, or temporary mechanical barriers to separate and prevent contact between the line and the material or equipment or the person performing the work, activity or function.
- (C) The person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for the work, activity, or function shall pay the operator of the high voltage overhead line the actual expense incurred by the operator in providing the clearance prescribed in the agreement. The operator may require payment in advance and is not required to provide the clearance until the person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for the work, activity, or function makes the payment.
- (D) If the actual expense of providing the clearance is less than the amount paid, the operator of the high voltage overhead line shall refund the surplus amount

SECTION 004. RESTRICTION ON ALL ACTIVITIES NEAR LINES

- (A) Unless a person, firm, corporation, or association effectively guards against danger by contact with the line as prescribed by Section 752.003, the person, firm, corporation, or association, either individually or through an agent or employee, may not perform a function or activity on land, a building, a highway, or other premises if at any time it is possible that the person performing the function or activity may:
- (1) move or be placed within six feet of a high voltage overhead line while performing the function or activity; or
- (2) bring any part of a tool, equipment, machine, or material within six feet of a high voltage overhead line while performing the function or activity.
- (B) A person, firm, corporation, or association may not require an employee to perform a function or activity prohibited by Subsection (A)

SECTION 005. RESTRICTION ON OPERATION OF MACHINERY AND PLACEMENT OF STRUCTURES NEAR LINES

Unless a person, firm, corporation, or association effectively guards against danger by contact with the line as prescribed by Section 752,003, the person, firm, corporation, or association, either individually or through an agent or employee, may not:

- (1) erect, install, transport, or store all or any part of a house, building, or other structure within six feet of a high voltage overhead line;
- (2) install, operate, transport, handle, or store all or any part of a tool, machine, or equipment within six feet of a high voltage overhead line; or
- (3) transport, handle, or store all or any part of supplies or materials within six feet of a high voltage overhead line.

SECTION 006. RESTRICTION ON OPERATION OF CERTAIN MACHINERY OR EQUIPMENT

- (A) A person, firm, corporation, or association, individually, through an agent or employee, or as an agent or employee, may not operate a crane, derrick, power shovel, drilling rig, hayloader, haystacker, mechanical cotton picker, pile driver, hoisting equipment, or similar apparatus any part of which is capable of vertical, lateral, or swinging motion unless:
- (1) a warning sign is posted and maintained as prescribed by Subsections (B) and (C);
- (2) an insulated cage-type guard or protective device is installed about the boom or arm of the equipment, except a backhoe or dipper; and
- (3) each lifting line, if the equipment includes a lifting hook device, is equipped with an insulator link on the lift hook connection.
- (B) The warning sign required by Subsection (A) (1) must be a weather-resistant sign of not less than five inches by seven inches with a yellow background and black lettering that reads:
- "WARNING" -- UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE THIS EQUIPMENT WITHIN TENFEET OF HIGH VOLTAGE LINES."
 - (C) The warning sign must be legible at 12 feet and placed:
- (1) within the equipment so that it is readily visible to the equipment operator while at the equipment controls; and
- (2) on the outside of the equipment in the number and location necessary to make it readily visible to a mechanic or other person engaged in the work.
- (D) Notwithstanding the distance limitations prescribed by Sections 752.004 and 752.005, unless a person, firm, corporation, or association effectively guards against danger by contact with the line as prescribed by Section 752.003, the person, firm, corporation, or association may not operate all or any part of a machine or equipment described by this section within 10 feet of a high voltage overhead line.

SECTION 007, CRIMINAL PENALTY

- (A) A person, firm, corporation, or association or an agent or employee of a person, firm, corporation, or association commits an offense if the person, firm, corporation, association, agent, or employee violates this chapter.
- (B) An offense under this section is punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$1,000, confinement in jail for not more than one year, or both.

SECTION 008. LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES

If a violation of this chapter results in physical or electrical contact with a high voltage overhead line, the person, firm, corporation, or association that committed the violation is liable to the owner or operator of the line for all damages to the facilities and for all liability that the owner or operator incurs as a result of the contact.

CHAPTER 752 - Safety of persons engaged in activities in proximity of high voltage electric lines; restrictions

SECTION 001. DEFINITIONS

(1) "High voltage" means more than 600 volts measured between conductors or between a conductor and the ground.

(2) "Overhead line" means a bare or insulated electric conductor installed above ground but does not include a conductor that is de-energized and grounded or that is enclosed in a rigid metallic conduit.

SECTION 002. EXEMPTION FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES AND

(A) This chapter does not apply to the construction, reconstruction, operation, or maintenance by an authorized person of overhead electrical or communication circuits or conductors and their supporting structures and associated equipment that are part of a rail transportation system, an electrical generating, transmission, or distribution system or a communication system.

(B) In this section, "authorized person" means:

(1) an employee of a light and power company, an electric cooperative, or a municipality working on his employer's electrical system;

(2) an employee of a transportation system working on the system's electrical circuits,

(3) an employee of a communication utility,

(4) an employee of a state, county, or municipal agency that has authorized circuit construction on the poles or structures that belong to an electric power company, an electric cooperative, a municipal or transportation system, or a communication system

(5) an employee of an industrial plant who works on the plant's

electrical system; or

(6) an employee of an electrical or communications contractor who is working under the contractor's supervision.

SECTION 003. TEMPORARY CLEARANCE OF LINES

(A) A person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for temporary work or a temporary activity or function closer to a high voltage overhead line than the distances prescribed by this chapter must notify the operator of the line at least 48 hours before the work begins

(B) A person, firm, corporation, or association may not begin the work, activity, or function under this section until the person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for the work, activity, or function and the owner or operator, or both, of the high voltage overhead line have negotiated a satisfactory mutual arrangement to provide temporary de-energization and grounding, temporary relocation or raising of the line, or temporary mechanical barriers to separate and prevent contact between the line and the material or equipment or the person performing the work, activity or function.

(C) The person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for the work, activity, or function shall pay the operator of the high voltage overhead line the actual expense incurred by the operator in providing the clearance prescribed in the agreement. The operator may require payment in advance and is not required to provide the clearance until the person, firm, corporation, or association responsible for the work, activity, or function makes the payment.

(D) If the actual expense of providing the clearance is less than the amount paid, the operator of the high voltage overhead line shall refund the surplus amount.

SECTION 004. RESTRICTION ON ALL ACTIVITIES NEAR LINES

(A) Unless a person, firm, corporation, or association effectively guards against danger by contact with the line as prescribed by Section 752 003, the person, firm, corporation, or association, either individually or through an agent or employee, may not perform a function or activity on land, a building, a highway, or other premises if at any time it is possible that the person performing the function or activity may:

(1) move or be placed within six feet of a high voltage overhead line

while performing the function or activity; or

(2) bring any part of a tool, equipment, machine, or material within six feet of a high voltage overhead line while performing the function or activity

(B) A person, firm, corporation, or association may not require an employee to perform a function or activity prohibited by Subsection (A)

SECTION 005, RESTRICTION ON OPERATION OF MACHINERY AND PLACEMENT OF STRUCTURES NEAR LINES

Unless a person, firm, corporation, or association effectively guards against danger by contact with the line as prescribed by Section 752.003, the person, firm, corporation, or association, either individually or through an agent or employee, may not:

(1) erect, install, transport, or store all or any part of a house, building, or other structure within six feet of a high voltage overhead line;

(2) install, operate, transport, handle, or store all or any part of a tool, machine, or equipment within six feet of a high voltage overhead line; or

(3) transport, handle, or store all or any part of supplies or materials within six feet of a high voltage overhead line.

SECTION 006. RESTRICTION ON OPERATION OF CERTAIN MACHINERY OR EQUIPMENT

(A) A person, firm, corporation, or association, individually, through an agent or employee, or as an agent or employee, may not operate a crane, derrick, power shovel, drilling rig, hayloader, haystacker, mechanical cotton picker, pile driver, hoisting equipment, or similar apparatus any part of which is capable of vertical, lateral, or swinging motion unless:

(1) a warning sign is posted and maintained as prescribed by Subsections (B) and (C);

(2) an insulated cage-type guard or protective device is installed about the boom or arm of the equipment, except a backhoe or dipper, and
(3) each lifting line, if the equipment includes a lifting hook device, is

equipped with an insulator link on the lift hook connection.

(B) The warning sign required by Subsection (A) (1) must be a weather-resistant sign of not less than five inches by seven inches with a yellow background and black lettering that reads

WARNING -- UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE THIS EQUIPMENT WITHIN TEN FEET OF HIGH VOLTAGE LINES.

(C) The warning sign must be legible at 12 feet and placed:

(1) within the equipment so that it is readily visible to the equipment operator while at the equipment controls; and

(2) on the outside of the equipment in the number and location necessary to make it readily visible to a mechanic or other person engaged in the work

(D) Notwithstanding the distance limitations prescribed by Sections 752. 004 and 752.005, unless a person, firm, corporation, or association effectively guards against danger by contact with the line as prescribed by Section 752.003, the person, firm, corporation, or association may not operate all or any part of a machine or equipment described by this section within 10 feet of a high voltage overhead line.

SECTION 007, CRIMINAL PENALTY

(A) A person, firm, corporation, or association or an agent or employee of a person, firm, corporation, or association commits an offense if the person, firm, corporation, association, agent, or employee violates this chapter

(B) An offense under this section is punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 or more than \$1,000, confinement in jail for not more than one year, or

SECTION 008. LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES

If a violation of this chapter results in physical or electrical contact with a high voltage overhead line, the person, firm, corporation, or association that committed the violation is liable to the owner or operator of the line for all damages to the facilities and for all liability that the owner or operator incurs as a result of the contact.

TPWD Programs are all "reimbursement of HCWCID No. 96 paid invoices"

Set Up: TPWD will send out a notification to HCWCID No. 96 for a Direct Deposit registration and set up. GDS will coordinate with your bookkeeper to file the completed set up with TPWD.

All reports and contracts are filed with TPWD using their electronic RGO system. GDS manages all submittal of all documents to RGO.

A. Sources of Funds: This project is organized into 3 parts

Part I: Land Donation Value \$150,000 est. Part II: HCWCID No. 96 Cash Match \$350,000 HCWCID No. 96 Cash Overmatch \$650,000 \$500,000 .

Part III TPWD Grant Funds

\$ 1,650,000 TOTAL:

- **B.** Prerequisites for drawing grant funds
 - Value of Land: We must secure TPWD approval of the Appraisal
 - Title Transfer: We must establish HCWCID No. 96 as the land owner, with the final transfer of title documents
 - Dec 2018 TPWD must revise the grant agreement for HCWCID No.96. The Board needs to approve and sign. Then GDS will submit to TPWD.
- **C. Invoices.** GDS needs to pre-approve all invoices for which reimbursement is to be requested. When you receive an invoice, do not pay. Simply forward to Grant Development Services at kataustin@austin.rr.com for review and approval. GDS will review for compliance with TPWD requirements.
- **D. Check Dispersal:** Once approved by GDS, invoices will be paid by the HCWCID No. 96 from the general account, in order to begin the reimbursement process. Once a cancelled check is available from your bank website, simply email to kataustin@austin.rr.com.
- E. Reimbursement Request: GDS will then prepare a reimbursement request for paid invoices. Reimbursement requests will include 1) Signed Certification 2) Schedule of invoices 3) Budget summary 4) Invoices and 5) Cancelled checks.

The reimbursement request will be sent for signature by e-mail. Once signed keep a copy of all items for your records and email only the signed pages to kataustin@austin.rr.com.

<u>Incidental costs such as publications are not included in the grant budget and are to be paid</u> with local funds.

- **F. Signed Reimbursement Request**. Once the HCWCID No. 96 signs the reimbursement request, GDS will upload the reimbursement request to the TPWD RGO website. GDS promptly responds to ANY AND ALL TPWD requests for information and will follow up.
- **G. Payment of Grant Funds**: GDS will be notified by the Texas Comptroller's Office of the TPWD direct deposit payment. GDS will notify you of the wire transfer to the HCWCID No. 96 bank account and provide instructions.

If you receive the payment by mail, deposit the state check into the HCWCID No. 96's general fund account.

- **H.** Structure of Reimbursement Requests: Grant Amount: \$500,000 The project is complicated by 1) land donation value and 2) local overmatch
 - 1. All invoices will be reimbursed at 100% until \$150,000 (value of land) is drawn down.
 - 2. Once we have submitted \$150,000 of reimbursement requests, TPWD will begin reimbursing at the 50% level.
 - 3. 50% reimbursements will continue until 95% of grant funds (\$475,000 of \$500,000) is drawn.
 - 4. Then the remaining expenditures will be considered overmatch until a Certificate of Construction Completion is issued. Continue sending invoices and cancelled checks to GDS.
 - 5. After TPWD staff conducts a final site inspection, the remaining 5% (\$25,000) can be drawn. GDS will already have sufficient invoices and cancelled checks in hand to prepare the final reimbursement request.

What is eligible for reimbursement: Construction costs, permit and registration fees, professional fees including engineering, landscape architect and application preparation fees.

HCWCID NO 96 will not be paid for the value of the land. That value is used as project match as shown in #1 above.

Bottomline: TPWD will reimburse HCWCID No. 96 for eligible expenses in the amount of \$500,000 over the term of the project. This payment system is no doubt confusing. GDS will be using their 20+ years of experience to manage all of the financial aspects of the project. GDS is available to consult with the District at any time on these issues.
