MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

May 7, 2019

HARRIS COUNTY WATER CONTROL AND IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 96

The Board of Directors (the "Board") of Harris County Water Control and Improvement District No. 96 (the "District") met in regular session, open to the public, at 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 7, 2019, at 1980 Post Oak Boulevard, Suite 1380, Houston, Texas, a designated meeting place outside the boundaries of the District, whereupon, the roll was called of the members of the Board, to-wit:

Linda Ihns - Assistant Secretary Amber Hurd - Assistant Secretary

All members of the Board were present except Director Hurd, thus constituting a quorum. Director Hurd subsequently entered the meeting in progress.

Also attending the meeting were Rusty Campbell of Fall Creek Development Partners, developers of property within the District; Cindy Fields of Brown & Gay Engineers, Inc. ("BGE"), engineer for the District; Robin Goin of Bob Leared Interests ("BLI"), tax-assessor/collector for the District; Kas Wright and Jerrod Lee of Lifestyle Directors, Inc. ("Lifestyle"), recreation director for the District Park; Debra Loggins of L&S District Services, LLC ("L&S"), bookkeeper for the District; Whitney Aelmore of SI Environmental ("SI"), operator for the District; Phil Halbert of Champions Hydro-Lawn, Inc. ("Champions"); Russell Wolff of Residential Recycling and Refuse Of Texas, Inc. ("RRRT"); Ana Izquierdo of Professional Grounds Management Services, LLC ("PGMS"); and Julianne B. Kugle, Ryan E. LaRue, Khari Dotson, and Mary Drews of Sanford Kuhl Hagan Kugle Parker Kahn LLP ("SK Law"), attorneys for the District.

The meeting was called to order at 12:08 p.m. Copies of the notices of the meeting are attached hereto.

HEAR FROM PUBLIC

The Board noted that there were no members of the public who wished to address the Board.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF APRIL 2, 2019

The Board reviewed the minutes from the meeting held April 2, 2019, previously distributed to the Board. Upon motion by Director Bates, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve such minutes as submitted.

REVIEW SECURITY REPORT

The Board reviewed the security report submitted by the Harris County Sheriff's Office. The Board took no action regarding such matter.

Director Jackson questioned the status of the Agreement for Funding Law Enforcement Services by and between the District and the Fall Creek Homeowner's Association ("HOA") approved by the Board at a previous meeting. Mr. LaRue stated that he has not yet received a response from the HOA. Director Sileo noted that the HOA will meet on Tuesday, May 14th.

The Board discussed the Agreement with the HOA, noting the increase in the amount charged by the Harris County Sheriff's Department to the HOA annually. Director Jackson questioned whether the District should consider forming its own police department if the costs for security continue to increase.

Ms. Kugle discussed with the Board the process for forming a District police department, and noted that it is very expensive for a water district to operate a police department.

After discussion, the Board took no action regarding such matter.

REVIEW WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION REPORT

The Board recognized Mr. Wolff, who informed the Board that Curtis Brown is no longer with RRRT and that he would now be the RRRT representative attending the meetings of the Board. He then reviewed with the Board a report on collection of solid waste and recycling materials within the District, a copy of which is attached hereto.

The Board requested that Mr. Wolff confirm the shredding event within the District scheduled for the first weekend after Labor Day in September.

RECREATION REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Wright, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Recreation Report for the month of April, a copy of which is attached hereto. She updated the Board on repairs ongoing in the Park, including pictures of the same.

Ms. Wright discussed with the Board the option of installation of steel bollards filled with concrete on the gravel road, as discussed at the previous meeting. She stated that she had received a proposal from Bellex for ordering and installing 20 bollards at a cost of \$11,850.00. She stated that the bollards would be placed close enough in proximity to alleviate the need for chains connecting each bollard. She noted that the bollards cannot be folded to allow emergency vehicles to pass. The Board discussed whether or not emergency vehicles would need to be able to enter the field areas. Ms. Wright noted that two of the bollards could be spaced farther apart to allow emergency vehicles to enter if necessary.

After discussion, the Board requested that Ms. Wright obtain additional proposals for installation of bollards for review by the Board at the next meeting. The Board took no action regarding such matter.

Ms. Wright informed the Board that the Spica replacement parts discussed at the previous meeting are on back order and will not be received until August, 2018. She stated that if such equipment becomes unsafe, it will be removed until the parts have been received.

Ms. Wright then reviewed with the Board a Fall Creek Sports Complex Checklist prepared by Lifestyle and a Checklist prepared by PGMS, copies of which are attached hereto. Ms. Wright further submitted to and reviewed with the Board a proposal from PGMS for landscaping/plant replacement within the Park, a copy of which is attached hereto. She noted that the cost to the District would be \$15,556.74.

The Board discussed the plants included in the proposal with Ms. Izquierdo. Ms. Izquierdo stated that PGMS would maintain the plants after planting.

At this point, Director Hurd entered the meeting.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the proposal from PGMS for landscaping/plant replacement within the Park as submitted.

Director Jackson expressed his opinion that Bellex should not be the only company submitting proposals for repairs within the Park, and that Lifestyle should obtain additional proposals for repairs. He stated that Bellex had charged a large amount to the District for the shipping of the picnic tables. The Board requested that Ms. Wright provide a copy of the invoice submitted by Bellex for shipping the picnic tables for review at the next meeting.

The Board then reviewed the invoices submitted by Bellex for the month of April as detailed on the Report.

After review of the invoices for the repairs, it was noted that the cost of some of the repairs may have been too small

to request proposals. It was also noted that the work performed by Bellex is ongoing during the month. Director Ihns expressed concern that obtaining additional proposals might delay repairs that need to be made on a timely basis.

Director Jackson suggested that the amount that the Recreation Director can approve for any one repair or service be reduced from \$5,000.00 per repair or service to \$2,500.00 per repair or service, and that proposals be obtained for any repairs or services which will exceed \$2,500.00.

Upon motion by Director Jackson, seconded by Director Bates, and after full discussion, the Board voted three (3) ayes to two (2) nays to reduce the amount that the Recreation Director can approve for any one repair or service from \$5,000.00 per repair or service to \$2,500.00 per repair or service, and to authorize the Recreational Director to obtain additional proposals for any repairs or services which will exceed \$2,500.00.

The Board determined that any health and/or safety issues should be handled immediately.

Director Sileo informed the Board that he had received an email requesting that the Board consider installation of a "Little Free Library" in the Sports Complex. The Board noted that there would need to be discussion regarding what entity would maintain such a structure. After discussion, the Board took no action at this time.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Recreation Report as submitted.

Mr. Halbert noted that approximately 10 acres located within the District on the west side of the Park are not being moved and maintained. Ms. Izquierdo stated that she would relay the information to PGMS so that maintenance could begin immediately.

TAX ASSESSOR/COLLECTOR'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Goin, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Tax Assessor/Collector's Report for the month of April, a copy of which is attached hereto. She noted that approximately 97.823% of the 2018 taxes had been collected. Ms. Goin also submitted to the Board the delinquent list.

Upon motion by Director Jackson, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Tax Assessor/Collector's Report as submitted.

BOOKKEEPER'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Loggins, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Bookkeeper's Report, including payment of the checks listed therein, as well as a budget comparison and the investment report, copies of

which are attached hereto. She informed the Board that the invoice received from the City of Houston (the "City") for reclaimed water is being back billed to Escalante Redstone Golf Club.

Upon motion by Director Jackson, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Bookkeeper's Report and payment of the checks listed therein.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Fields, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board the Engineer's Report, a copy of which is attached hereto. She updated the Board on ongoing engineering matters.

Ms. Fields discussed with the Board Water Well No. 1 (the "Well"). She stated that the Notice of Compliance has been received from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality ("TCEQ"), as discussed at the previous meeting, and that the TCEQ case is now closed and the District is in full compliance. She informed the Board that the Well is now on line.

Ms. Fields next discussed with the Board the contract for construction of Lift Station No. 6 and Force Main (the "Lift Station"). She stated that Reddico Construction Co., Inc. ("Reddico") has completed construction and that the final inspection was held on April 11th. She then submitted to and reviewed with the Board Pay Estimate No. 7 and Final to Reddico in the amount of \$59,049.19, and recommended payment of the same. Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Bates, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve payment of Pay Estimate No. 7 and Final as submitted, based upon the recommendation of the District Engineer.

Ms. Fields informed the Board that BGE and HydroGeo Designs, LLC ("HydroGeo") have walked the portion of the Channel located north of Mesa Drive as discussed at the previous meeting, and that a report of recommended improvements is being prepared for review by the Board. She stated that such report should be available at the regular meeting of the Board scheduled for July.

Ms. Kugle informed the Board that the District has received a letter of support from the Humble Independent School District ("Humble ISD") in connection with the proposed widening of Mesa Drive, as discussed at the previous meeting, and that she is waiting for a support letter from the HOA. She stated that Harris County (the "County") has confirmed that after receipt of the letters of support, the County will contact the County Engineering Department to begin preparing a proposed interlocal agreement which will outline each entity's responsibilities.

Ms. Fields informed the Board that she had been contacted by a representative of DCP Midstream ("DCP"), a pipeline company, regarding upcoming maintenance work that will be performed along the DCP easement, a portion

of which runs through the District's sports complex. She stated that DCP has indicated that such work will not begin until January, 2020, and that DCP will make every attempt to work to the east of the proposed dog park, but would need to utilize the pipeline easement for access. She noted that the District may want to postpone construction of the proposed dog park until such time as DCP has completed the maintenance work.

Ms. Fields informed the Board that the application for approval by the TCEQ for release of escrowed funds and use of surplus funds in connection with construction of Lift Station No. 6 is complete. Ms. Kugle then submitted to and reviewed with the Board a proposed Resolution Requesting Approval from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for Release of Escrowed Funds and Approval of Use of Surplus Funds.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Resolution Requesting Approval from the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for Release of Escrowed Funds and Approval of Use of Surplus Funds, and to approve the Engineer's Report as submitted.

HEAR DEVELOPER'S REPORT

Mr. Campbell updated the Board on ongoing development within the District. The Board noted that no action was required.

OPERATOR'S REPORT

The Board recognized Ms. Aelmore, who presented the Operator's Report for the month of April, a copy of which is attached hereto. Ms. Aelmore updated the Board regarding operations within the District.

Ms. Aelmore then submitted to and reviewed with the Board the delinquent accounts. She stated that proper notice had been given as well as the opportunity to be heard in order to explain, contest, or correct the utility service bills and show reason why utility service should not be terminated for reason of nonpayment, all as required by the District's Rate Order. It was noted by the Board that Fall Creek Plaza is delinquent in utility payments and tax payments.

Upon motion by Director Ihns, seconded by Director Sileo, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to authorize termination of service to the customers listed on the delinquent list, as the customers were neither present at the meeting nor presented any written statement on the matter.

Ms. Aelmore also submitted to and reviewed with the Board the collection report prepared by Penn Credit Corporation, a copy of which is attached hereto.

Ms. Aelmore next submitted to and reviewed with the Board a draft of the Consumer Confidence Report ("CCR"), a copy of which is attached hereto, and stated that the CCR would be submitted to the District's consultants for review and comment. She further stated that the CCR, once completed, would be mailed to the District's customers by July 1, 2019.

Ms. Aelmore submitted a written request from SI for an accumulated percentage rate increase based upon the consumer price index, and noted that such increase would be 1.1%, as provided for in the agreement between the District and SI.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the Operator's Report as submitted, and to approve the CCR, subject to incorporation of any comments by the District consultants.

REPORT FROM CHAMPION'S HYDRO-LAWN

The Board recognized Mr. Halbert, who submitted to and reviewed with the Board a written report and pictures regarding repair and maintenance of detention and drainage facilities within the District, a copy of which is attached hereto.

The Board noted that no action was required.

HEAR ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Ms. Kugle informed the Board that the Strategic Partnership Agreement ("SPA") between the District and the City will expire in 2036. She stated that the City has expressed interest in extending the term of the SPA by thirteen (13) years, and questioned whether the Board would be interested in extending the SPA.

After discussion, the Board expressed its interest in extending the SPA for an additional 13 years, and authorized Ms. Kugle to contact the City regarding the Board's decision.

Consider adopt of Resolution Requesting TCEQ Approval for Change in Scope and Use of Surplus Funds [P-133 Channel Improvements]

Ms. Kugle recommended that the Board defer adoption of such Resolution until more information has been presented by the District Engineer regarding proposed improvements to the Channel, as discussed earlier in the meeting.

It was the consensus of the Board to defer any action in connection with adoption of the proposed Resolution at this time.

Adopt Order Evidencing Review of Emergency Preparedness Plan

The Board next considered adoption of a proposed Order Evidencing Review of Emergency Preparedness Plan. Ms. Fields informed the Board that the Emergency Preparedness Plan ("EPP") has been updated and revised to include, among other things, construction of the Well. Director Jackson noted that the Constable would need to be revised to now reflect the Harris County Sheriff's Department. The Board discussed additional entities which may need to be added to the contact list, and requested that Directors Jackson and Sileo be added to such list. Ms. Kugle recommended that the Board review the EPP and submit any comments regarding the same to SK Law or BGE.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Order Evidencing Review of Emergency Preparedness Plan, subject to incorporation of the revisions discussed and any comments by members of the Board after review.

Adopt Amended Rate Order

Ms. Kugle noted that the District had received a letter from the City regarding an increase of 2.8% in the annual rate charged for water and sewer service, effective April 1, 2019, as discussed at the previous meeting. A copy of such letter is attached hereto. She reviewed with the Board an amended Rate Schedule, which reflects the new costs to the District from the City, as well as the 1.1% accumulated percentage rate increase submitted by SI, a copy of which is attached hereto, which Schedule will be incorporated into the Amended Rate Order.

Upon motion by Director Sileo, seconded by Director Ihns, and after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to adopt the Order Adopting Consolidated Rate Order and Rules and Regulations; Establishing A Drought Contingency Plan; Establishing A Wastewater Control Order; Establishing Certain Other Policies; and Providing Penalties for Violation Thereof, effective May 1, 2019.

Consider approval of Encroachment Agreement

It was the consensus of the Board to defer adoption of the Encroachment Agreement at this time.

Director Sileo informed the Board that BGE performed a survey of the location proposed for Phase 1 of the trail system, as authorized by the HOA, and that he would check on the progress being made by the HOA.

Approve engagement letter (arbitrage compliance)

The Board next reviewed engagement letters submitted by Municipal Risk Management Group for determining the arbitrage compliance in connection with the District's Series 2009 Bonds, Series 2010 Bonds, Series 2014 Bonds and the District's Series 2015 Bonds. Upon motion by Director Jackson, seconded by Director Ihns, and

after full discussion, the Board voted unanimously to approve the engagement letters between the District and Municipal Risk Management Group as submitted.

RECEIVE ARCHITECT/ENGINEER REPORT REGARDING PARK PROJECT

Mr. LaRue informed the Board that BGE had informed him that the construction plans for the Park Project are complete. He further stated that the appraiser of the 23.3 acre detention pond is working with representatives of the TCEQ to resolve the discrepancies in the appraisal, as discussed at the previous meeting.

Ms. Kugle informed the Board that Senate Bill 239 is being revised to require that the tax rate hearing conducted by the Boards of Directors of Districts is to be recorded, and further provides that a Board of Directors will consider moving meetings of the Board to a location within the District if requested by a resident of the District to do so. She further stated that such Bill has several internet website posting requirements. She informed the Board that there are companies that host websites and the Board may want to consider updates to the District's website. The Board noted that this matter should be discussed with other municipal utility district board members at the upcoming Association of Water Board Directors ("AWBD") conference.

Director Jackson informed the Board that the Fall Creek Elementary School Parent Teacher Organization has requested that the Fall Creek community participate in a survey regarding construction of a second school in the area. Director Hurd suggested that information regarding the survey be included in the utility bills sent to the customers of the District.

THERE being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

- I. <u>BASE OPERATIONS FEE (1)</u>: For and in consideration of services outlined in the Article I of this Contract and rendered to and on behalf of the District by SE, the District agrees to pay to SE, each month, a base operations fee equal to:

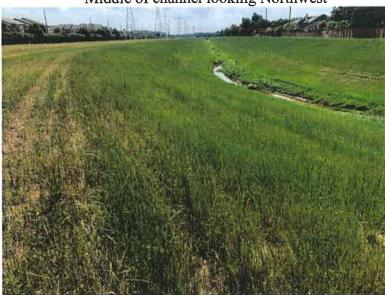
